THIS IS MY BODY' - APPROACHING THE EUCHARIST It is important that we always approach the Eucharist with reverence and respect. Since the start of Covid certain practices around reception of the Blessed Sacrament changed. Now that the pandemic is well over this is an opportune time perhaps to remind parishioners of the

current proper practices in the Church. USE OF PYXES IN THE CHURCH

The use of a pyx for personal consumption in the church has now been discontinued and Communion should only be received either in the hand or on the tongue, from both priests and Eucharistic Ministers.

PROPER RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION If a communicant is receiving Communion on the hand they MUST consume the Host before they leave the presence of the priest or the Eucharistic Minister. Under no circumstances should you leave the Communion station until you have consumed the Host. There is no reason for someone to return to their seat to consume the Host. There are a number of seats where people with limited mobility may sit close to the Communion stations, including close to the doors in all churches in the parish.

COMMUNION TO THE SICK AND HOUSEBOUND - We are deeply grateful to those who bring Communion to the sick and housebound on a regular basis. This is a deeply valued ministry, both by the Parish and by the people receiving. Anyone wishing to avail of this should contact the Presbytery. Those bringing Communion in a pyx outside of the church must beforehand have the expressed consent of Fr. Charlie. This is to ensure that there are no abuses of the Eucharist. Communion should ONLY be brought in a pyx and no other vessel or cloth - check with parish staff. Those taking Communion from the church should be free to go directly to the person receiving Communion, they should be clear of all other tasks such as shopping so as not to be unduly keeping the Blessed Sacrament on their person. Under no circumstances should people take Hosts to be used at a later time and Hosts should not be kept overnight for any reason. Again it is important that we show proper respect and devotion to the Eucharist and all of the above is to make sure that happens

Over the last few years Croagh Patrick stakeholders group have been responsible for monumental work in preserving and safeguarding the mountain. As the largest annual gathering on the Reek it is essential that Reek Sunday pilgrims and indeed all pilgrims play their part: Croagh Patrick is an iconic feature of the Mayo landscape of significant natural, cultural and spiritual importance. While the National Pilgrimage Day on Croagh Patrick stretches back many generations, we are conscious of the obligation to support the conservation of the mountain for future generations.

The Church has actively engaged with other Stakeholders to undertake the Sustainable Access and Habitat Restoration project currently underway on it which aims to provide a robust path for access and to restore the eroded parts of the mountain. As part of our support for the project, we have committed to minimising the impact of pilgrimage on Croagh Patrick, the drinking water that comes from the mountain streams, the local community and other users of the mountain. In order to do this, we ask each pilgrim to comply with the following;

- 1. If traveling by car, please park responsibly and follow the instructions of stewards on the day.
- 2. Stay on the defined path on the mountain (where in place) and do not encroach on the adjoining habitat which may be in the process of restoration.
- 3. The mountain streams provide drinking water for the local community. Be respectful of this while on the mountain.
- 4. We endorse the Leave no Trace Principle. Please do not discard any litter on the mountain.
- 5. It should also be noted that there are no dogs allowed on the mountain. Please respect this requirement.
