DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. We encourage as many people as possible to join the the 3:00pm prayers in Westport church.

'THIS IS MY BODY' - APPROACHING THE EUCHARIST

It is important that we always approach the Eucharist with reverence and respect. Since the start of Covid certain practices around reception of the Blessed Sacrament changed. Now that the pandemic is well over this is an opportune time perhaps to remind parishioners of the current proper practices in the Church. <u>USE OF PYXES IN THE CHURCH</u>

The use of a pyx for personal consumption in the church has now been discontinued and Communion should only be received either in the hand or on the tongue, from both priests and Eucharistic Ministers.

PROPER RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

If a communicant is receiving Communion on the hand they <u>MUST</u> consume the Host before they leave the presence of the priest or the Eucharistic Minister. Under no circumstances should you leave the Communion station until you have consumed the Host. There is no reason for someone to return to their seat to consume the Host. There are a number of seats where people with limited mobility may sit close to the Communion stations, including close to the doors in all churches in the parish.

COMMUNION TO THE SICK AND HOUSEBOUND – We are deeply grateful to those who bring Communion to the sick and housebound on a regular basis. This is a deeply valued ministry, both by the Parish and by the people receiving. Anyone wishing to avail of this should contact the Presbytery. Those bringing Communion in a pyx outside of the church must beforehand have the expressed consent of Fr. Charlie. This is to ensure that there are no abuses of the Eucharist. Communion should ONLY be brought in a pyx and no other vessel or cloth – check with parish staff. Those taking Communion from the church should be free to go directly to the person receiving Communion, they should be clear of all other tasks such as shopping so as not to be unduly keeping the Blessed Sacrament on their person. Under no circumstances should people take hosts to be used at a later time and Hosts should not be kept overnight for any reason. Again it is important that we show proper respect and devotion to the Eucharist and all of the above is to make sure that happens.

Plant trees or a pollinator garden.

Trees are one of the most powerful tools to combat the climate crisis. Plant a tree/s or donate to campaigns, like <u>EARTHDAY.ORG's</u> *"The Canopy Project"* to help reforestation efforts across the world. Pollination is essential for all terrestrial life on Earth. <u>PLANT A</u> <u>POLLINATOR GARDEN</u> using species native to your area to support local populations of butterflies, bees, and other organisms critical to sustained biodiversity in your ecosystem.
