#### WHY IS SYNOD ESSENTIAL IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH?

Since the Second Vatican Council of the 1960s, called to open the church to the modern world, bishops have met periodically to continue the collegiality of that landmark meeting in what are called synods to discuss specific issues to better guide the church.

The theme of the Synod in Rome this year is "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission." These three dimensions are profoundly interrelated. They are the vital pillars of a Synodal Church. The synod is dialogue between baptized people in the name of the Church, on the life of the Church, on dialogue with the world, on the problems that affect humanity today.

We read in Revelation 20: 6. "We want to be together with Christ as soon as possible and work alongside Him. We are preparing ourselves for this already today."

And that is why our annual motto for 2023 is: Serving and reigning with Christ.
